Through a variety of activities and assessments, students will learn to respectfully consider diverse viewpoints, how to clearly articulate their own verbal or written responses, and how to discover meaningful, personal connections to literature.

During class → Be an active participant in your learning. Listen, collaborate, and ask questions.

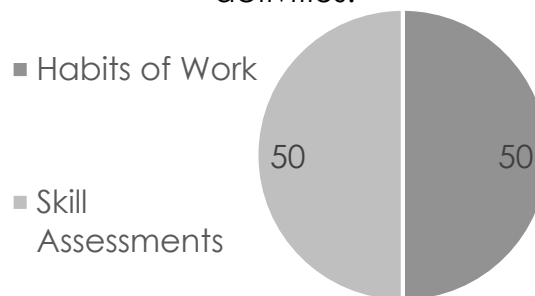
End of class → Stay in your seat until dismissal by Mrs. LaFlamme. Be sure to write down any upcoming due dates and homework assignments!

As stated in the Student Handbook, cell phones are to remain off and stored during the school day. Cell phone use is



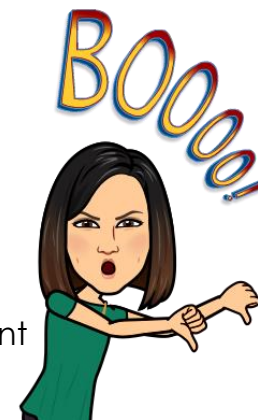
prohibited in the classroom unless students are given specific instructions for using them during an academic activity. **Violation of this policy will result in the device being confiscated for the remainder of the school day.**
