OVERVIEW Learning Targets

Honors English 1 has a two-fold purpose: to improve student's ability to read critically and interpret different forms of literature and to develop a student's ability to write effectively. Through careful reading of a variety of literature, students develop skills in analysis and interpretation, with a sharp focus on author intent, use of literary devices, and developing original, critical claims. Students will participate in meaningful discussions using their own analysis and interpretations, guiding their own learning through the Socratic Method. In addition, this course introduces students to the sophisticated style of analytical writing. Extensive writing is required for this course. Students will work to improve their writing through a structured and focused process, including thorough draft revisions. Finally, students will continue to develop their ability to comprehend challenging texts and communicate effectively through the study of college-level vocabulary.

- ✓ I can use technological resources to produce a writing product.
- ✓ I can engage in small group discussions without teacher guidance.
- ✓ I can read and understand a variety of literature.
- I can connect a literary text to essential questions about the human condition and societal issues.


During class → Be an active participant in your learning. Listen, collaborate, and ask questions.
