What is a passion project?

A passion project for independent reading is a project that reflects not only the joy that your reading brings to you, but it also reflects other things that bring you happiness. For example, if art brings you joy, create a masterpiece drawing that reflects the themes in your novel. If music brings you joy, write and record a song that reflects the plot, conflict, or characters from a story. Passion Project: LEARNING TARGETS

KEY IDEAS AND DETAILS:

- I can cite strong and thorough textual evidence to support an analysis of what the text says explicitly as well as inferences drawn from the text.
- I can determine a theme or central idea of a text and analyze in detail its development over the course of the text, including how it emerges and is shaped and refined by specific details;
- I can analyze how complex characters (e.g., those with multiple or conflicting motivations) develop over the course of a text, interact with other characters, and advance the plot or develop the theme.

CRAFT AND STRUCTURE:

- I can determine the meaning of words and phrases as they are used in the text, including figurative and connotative meanings; analyze the cumulative impact of specific word choices on meaning and tone (e.g., how the language evokes a sense of time and place; how it sets a formal or informal tone).
- I can analyze how an author's choices concerning how to structure a text, order events within it (e.g., parallel plots), and manipulate time (e.g., pacing, flashbacks) create such effects as mystery, tension, or surprise.
- I can analyze a particular point of view or cultural experience reflected in a work of literature from outside the United States, drawing on a wide reading of world literature.

INTEGRATION OF KNOWLEDGE AND IDEAS:

- I can analyze the representation of a subject or a key scene in two different artistic mediums, including what is emphasized or absent in each treatment (e.g., Auden's "Musée des Beaux Arts" and Breughel's Landscape with the Fall of Icarus).
- I can analyze how an author draws on and transforms source material in a specific work (e.g., how Shakespeare treats a theme or topic from Ovid or the Bible or how a later author draws on a play by Shakespeare).
